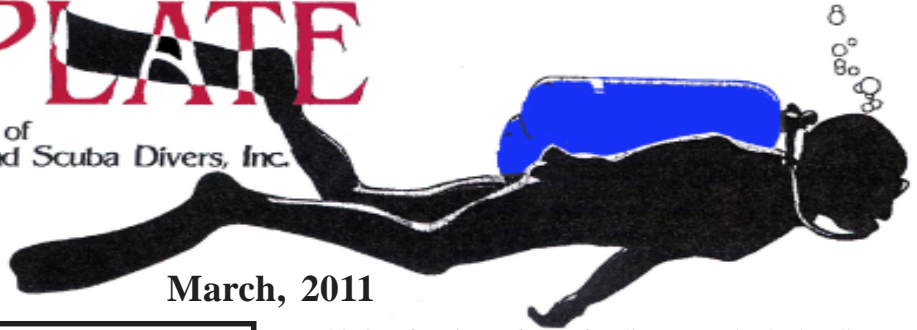

Rich Lauer brought the meeting to order at 9:10 a.m. Vivian Duff read the Council meeting minutes from the July 18, 2010 meeting at Portage Quarry. Per discussions, she suggested that the Personal Safety article left out of the Fall, 2010 Faceplate be included in a future 2011 Faceplate before the start of the summer dive season. Darrell Logan made a motion to accept the minutes as read. Sue Smith seconded the motion.

Lu Howard gave the Treasurer's Report. Darrell Logan made a motion to accept the treasurer's report subject to audit. Annette Soule seconded the motion.

Committee Reports

Legislative – No report.

O2 Vivian Duff read Scott Pansing's report in his absence. It will be included with the minutes.

Faceplate - Rich Lauer will generate a Faceplate in Spring, 2011.

License Report – No report per Rich Lauer

Put-in-Bay Clean-up – Patrx Heschel reported that the Sept, 2010 clean-up was cancelled due to the toxic algae in Lake Erie. The next event will be held on Sept. 19, 2011.

MAST – no report.

Scholarship – no report.

Promotions – Lu Howard said no report other than ScubaFest is coming up March 18 – 20, 2011 at the Crowne Plaza North in Columbus, OH

Speaker's Bureau – Rich asked Annette Soule to talk about it. The OCSSDI supports speaker fees to talk to dive clubs. OCSSDI tries to maintain a list of available speakers. It is a short list not used often, but it is available. Rich talks to the club presidents when they need an idea and he suggests the speaker's bureau.

ScubaFest – Darrell Logan gave a report. ScubaFest is coming up March 18 – 20, 2011 at the Crowne Plaza North in Columbus, OH with Sean Fisher, the grandson of treasure hunter Mel Fisher, as the banquet keynote speaker. One bar of gold is worth \$550,000. Some of the 2010 speakers will be returning such as Dave Trotter and there will be new speakers too. There will be public safety classes offered. Rich Lauer is teaching advanced Adobe Photoshop as a follow-up to the previous years' basic classes.

Bill Libecap has offered to teach 'Beyond the Basics' of underwater photography. Roger Roth will return. Sue Smith will present. Lu Howard will be manning the OC booth. Patrx Heschel will have a booth. The photo contest will be run by Rich Lauer and the deadline for entries is March 1, 2011 for the Ohio Regional Contest. Any underwater photographer who resides in Ohio or the states that touch Ohio is eligible to enter the contest.

Discover Scuba will be run again with help from Aquatic Adventures of Ohio. The 2010 Discover Scuba pool sessions had 50 people try scuba from which 50% were certified. The forms are available on the website for exhibitors, non-profits, regular attendees and volunteers. Nekton liveboard who was a supporter in 2010 has ceased operations. The Baja Aggressor liveboard is the grand prize for the photo contest with an estimated value of \$2,400 - \$2,800 depending on the dates picked by the prize winner.

Rich Lauer said 2 years ago there were 40 – 50 entries in the Great Lakes category. In March, 2010 there were only 2. He would like to see the number of entries go up again.

Roger Roth suggested taking lots of pictures and entering several contests over the years and you may win. Enter several shows each year and you may win purely from a different judging team. Vivian Duff asked a re-entry question and Rich Lauer confirmed that contestants can re-enter the same photos in the ScubaFest competition if it did not win in a previous year.

Lu Howard said OCSSDI hands out club info, but it is old. She asked that we include this request for 'new information' from the clubs. She will then pass out new information at the OC booth at ScubaFest.

Annette Soule asked Rich to include a paragraph in the Faceplate on the Speaker's Bureau as a reminder of its availability. Publish a list of speakers and their topic and that a \$50 stipend will be paid by OC. Rich said if we ask Sue Smith from Ann Arbor, OC would not cover her travel, but the club could pay it.

New Business

Rich Lauer received the By-Laws a year ago and the update is not yet complete. It is time to complete them. He will type and distribute the proposed changes. We need to have a meeting in early February to discuss the changes, update the By-Laws and complete the task by March, 2011.

Roger Roth talked to Mark Beatty. Some accountant said OC was remiss in filing papers with the IRS. Mark said he did not know if Form 990 had been completed in 3 years when our worth is less than \$25,000. Darrell Logan said the form is available on the IRS.gov website. Lu reported that the 'Statement of continued existence' was done in May, 2010 as she did it. Lu will file the Form 990.

Annette Soule asked if we need to discuss the \$50 cap on the stipend for the Speaker's Bureau. Rich Lauer will check old Faceplates for the reason of the cap at \$50. Roger Roth said it was at least 5 years ago. Sue Smith suggested that two clubs at the same location could share any additional speaker cost.

Annette Soule asked do we support Scuba for Diabetes? Rich said no. Good question for discussion. Scuba for Diabetes is just in the Cleveland area. Darrell has competed in an underwater puzzle event. It is a timed U/W event with a fee amount and donations to the event. Rich said we support Legends and Put-in-Bay which supports diving. Diabetes supports something else. We can put a notice in the January issue of Faceplate. Annette supports the event. Roger suggested we promote, but not necessarily give money. Jack Hardy says it is another way to get our name out on the list. Annette suggested research of does it bring dive clubs together? Jack Hardy asked we take the issue back to the local clubs for open discussion. Rich suggested he send e-mails. Teams pay a fee of approximately \$100. Roger Roth suggested an OCSSDI team. Judy says team gets own sponsor. We could sponsor a team with seed money. Annette/Rich helped the motion: OC will give seed money \$100 if Council members want to form a team to participate in the Cleveland Scuba for Diabetes on March 11, 2011. Annette made a motion to pass it and Roger seconded the motion. Riley Kilroy of BAD volunteered to form the team. Everyone present voted for the proposal.

Election of Trustees

Rich said it was time to vote for one 3-year trustee. Current 3 years are: Rich Lauer, Patrix Heschel and Elex Ali. In 2013, the newly voted Trustee will become the Head Trustee. Rich opened the floor for nominations:

Darrell Logan nominated Rich Lauer, he declined. Roger Roth nominated Rich Synowiec, he declined. Sue Smith nominated Jack Hardy. Annette Soule nominated Riley Kilroy. Rich Lauer nominated Bill Libecap, he declined. Voting commenced and Jack Hardy was elected as the new 3-year Trustee.

Next was the vote for four 1-year Trustees. Nominated were: Sue Smith, Rich Synowiec, Riley Kilroy, Judy Logan and Roger Roth. Elected were: Sue Smith, Rich Synowiec, Riley Kilroy and Roger Roth.

The ScubaFest Liaison to the Ohio Council is Judy Logan until March, 2011. Vivian Duff continues as OC Secretary.

Once voting was complete, Rich Lauer opened the discussion of how in 52 years of the OC does one club gets a vote towards Trustees? When he reviewed it, the By-Laws state that the Trustees picked the officers, but that is not how we presently do it. Should we have the Trustees made decisions? Is one rep from a club a good representation of member votes? We cannot have more than 1 trustee from the same club for fairness. Roger Roth asked what is the advantage of change? Rich Lauer said we could vote by phone or e-mail. Per Darrell Logan, the Trustees are responsible for the day-to-day operations. Rich Lauer asked is the rep present supporting the way their club would vote? Some clubs do vote for an OC rep to attend the meetings. Jack Hardy would like to see the Trustees conduct the day to day operations and the meeting be run by the clubs.

Perhaps we give the Head Trustee the right to table a motion. Bill Libecap pointed out that anyone can table a motion. Darrell Logan stated that Roberts Rules of Order says anyone can table a motion and all discussion stops.

Rich will send information in January and set up a February meeting. Annette Soule asked if a conference call is possible in order to attend. Rich Synowiec suggested a Skype connection. See Skype.com.

Roger Roth made a motion to adjourn. Rich adjourned the meeting at 10:37 a.m.

MAST Training Workshop

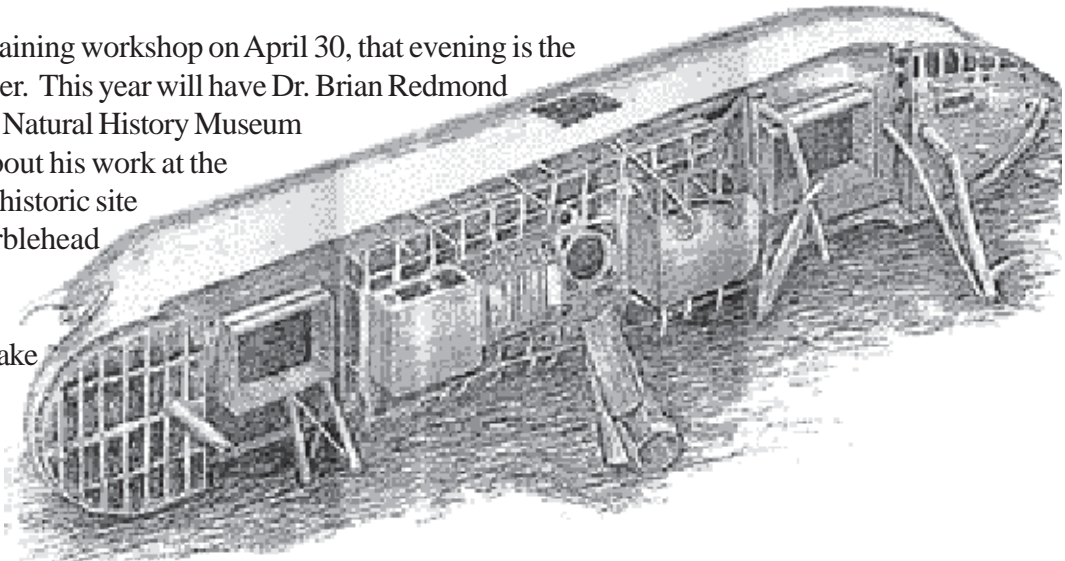

This letter is for those divers who have expressed interest in the Maritime Archaeological Survey Team (MAST) in the past. To become a member of MAST, all you have to do is complete the training workshop that MAST holds with the Great Lakes Historical Society. This year our training workshop will be held on April 30 and May 1 with the in water training taking place on May 21 and 22.

MAST is a great organization to be a part of. They are actively involved in protecting our submerged cultural heritage. This training program will teach you the basics of surveying, measuring, and detailing a shipwreck, why that work is important, and how to research the site from a historical perspective. This class is for divers and non-divers. While there is a lot to be done underwater, every good research project has a large on-land portion, so non-divers are encouraged to come and learn as well.

Along with the training workshop on April 30, that evening is the MAST annual dinner. This year will have Dr. Brian Redmond from the Cleveland Natural History Museum coming to speak about his work at the Danbury Site, a prehistoric site located on the Marblehead Peninsula, which indicates a healthy involvement with Lake Erie. ScubaFest 2011

Some Quick reminders: The 2011 ScubaFest takes place March 18-20, again at the Crowne Plaza North Hotel in Columbus. Last year's highly successful event brought more than 1,000 divers & friends, 35+ vendors in the free Exhibit Hall, excellent presentations, prizes galore, and good food and drinks Saturday night. Sean Fisher has long been a part of his Grandpa Mel's adventures. In his teenage years he spent his days at sea on the boats as part of the crew.

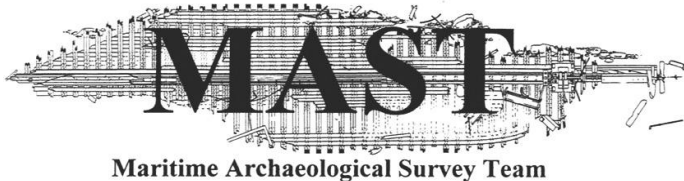

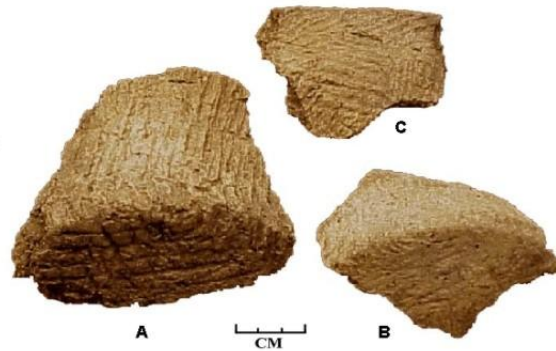

The Danbury Site: Clues about early Ohioans and their relationship to Lake Erie

The Danbury Site was discovered in 1977 on the southern coast of the Marblehead peninsula in Sandusky Bay. The site was believed to be Late Woodland (500 - 1000 AD) and was professionally excavated from 2003-2007 by archaeologists from the Cleveland Museum of Natural History. The finds show a society of seasonal habitation that was using pits to store food, including fish from the lake. There is a lot to be learned about the society from the burial practices, which have been found in abundance at the Danbury site. Evidence suggests a more permanent settlement with greater reliance on the Lake and horticulture in the Late-Prehistoric Period (1000 - 1750 AD)
